From now on you know him and have seen him." 8 Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father; that will be enough for us." 9 Jesus replied, "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been with you all this time? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father."

## "At The End Of The Day"

"Christianity at its core is about the self-referenced claim by a person who said, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life.' That person calls us into relationship with himself, which means communion with God. He showed and taught us that his way is love and mercy and forgiveness. His truth is not just his teaching but his person. His life is life indeed because in union with him we have communion with God.

The Christian claim is that at the end of the day, at the end of life, you and I have to deal with Jesus. Christianity is about a person and therefore it is about personhood. That means a great deal when we deal with people, especially people who differ from us in their faith, ethics, political ideas and worldviews."
